
Kitakyushu Innovation Gallery & Studio

The process from application to the day of the exchange

- As a general rule, applicants must fill out the designated application form and apply by email at least 2 months before the day they want to have an exchange.
- A school exchange coordinator will check the content of the application, then match the applicants with a school based on their objective, schedule, lodging location, the number of people who want to visit and other factors.
- The coordinator will inform the applicant when the school that will accept a visit has been decided on. The school exchange coordinator will contact the applicants as needed to make arrangements with regard to the wishes of both schools that will be involved in the exchange on the day in question.
- The school exchange coordinator will be present on the day of the exchange, so you can visit the school with no worries.

Requests (related to school exchange event timing)

It may be difficult to accept school exchanges during long school closures, when there are a lot of school events and during school admissions testing. If you would like to have a school exchange during such times, be sure to contact us at least two months in advance.

Long school closures (vary from school year to school year)

- Summer break / July 20 to Aug 31
- Winter break / Dec 25 to Jan 7
- Spring break / Mar 25 to Apr 7

Other times when it is difficult to accept a school exchange event

- During regular examinations: May, July, October, December (about 1 week each)
- During high school tests and the graduation ceremony in February-March


